

## Women's Bible Study

### Genesis 3

1. Who poses the first question in the Bible (verse 1)? Of what significance is this?
  
2. What do you think of Eve's response in verses 2-3? In what ways do we tend to make God's commands more restrictive than he intends and how does that affect our view of his requirements?
  
3. As the serpent interprets God's instructions, what does he promise in verses 4-5? From your experience how does Satan try to deceive us about the consequences and supposed benefits of sin?
  
4. In verses 9-13, God questions Adam and Eve but he does not question the serpent. Why do you think that is?
  
5. Before addressing Adam and Eve and before passing judgment on them, God condemns Satan in verse 15. The condemnation of Satan also contains the hope of Adam's race. What is meant by, "He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel?" How was this promise fulfilled and what does it mean to you personally?
  
6. Explain the difference between temptation and sin. Share with the Lord an area of temptation in your life that causes you the greatest concern. Share with your group a lesson you have learned from your study of this chapter that can help you recognize and resist a temptation you are facing.
